REQUIREMENTS

- A signed permission form from each youth must be submitted.
- Each youth will need a release from school (if in session). We encourage you to work with the school to help the students
 get academic credit for participation in this event.
- At least one qualified chaperone must accompany youth.
- Attending youth will be expected to participate in all scheduled events.
- Each city/town must provide transportation to and from the conference.
- Sufficient funding must be provided for any expenses not covered by the registration fee e.g., lodging, travel expenses, etc.

GUIDELINES

- Each city/town should inform its student delegation and parents what the conference is about as well as the rules and expectations of the League and host city.
- Youth should come prepared with information to share about their city/town.
- Find an appropriate way to have the youth report back on their experience so the larger community can benefit from each youth delegate's participation.



RULES AND PERMISSION

- Attendance by youth at the conference is a privilege extended by the League of Arizona Cities & Towns and the hosting
 city. This privilege may be conditioned or revoked at any time by the League or the host city.
- The League of Arizona Cities & Towns is not responsible for any expenses/obligations incurred by any youth attending
 its Annual Conference and associated events.
- The youth's sponsor city and designated chaperone are responsible for appropriate supervision and protection of the
 youth at all times.
- Participating youth are expected to conduct themselves at all times in a professional manner to the occasion.
- Youth are expected to wear appropriate "business casual" attire at all conference sessions, and may be asked to change
 if not in compliance. (E.g., slacks and collared shirt for boys and slacks and blouse for girls; NO tank tops, t-shirts,
 baggy pants, bare midriffs, flip-flops.)
- Participating youth must be in high school and involved in participating activities related to a city-sponsored Youth Commission or Youth Advisory Board.
- All youth delegations are limited to six students and must have at least one adult chaperone in attendance. The chaperone must be with the students at all times they are at the conference.
- Youth will refrain from use of alcohol or any other controlled substance at all times, including travel to and from the conference.
- Any youth violating these rules and those of his/her sponsoring city may be asked to return home immediately. In such
 case, the parent or legal guardian agrees to immediately come and get their child at his or her own expense.
